





WRITE ON, IRVING BERLIN! (Sleeping Bear Press): Four-year-old Irving Berlin arrived at Ellis Island with his family in 1893, penniless and speaking no English. Still, having escaped the Russian pogroms, the family was grateful to be in a country that promised freedom and opportunities. With tunes such as "God Bless America" (100 years old this year!), "White Christmas," and "Puttin' on the Ritz," Berlin created the soundtrack of 20th century America. He couldn't stop writing-on his shirtsleeves, in taxis, even in the bathtub! And he never stopped feeling thankful for his new home, donating much of the money he made from his music back to the country that had adopted him.
